CHAIR MORRIS MENTIONED THAT THE MAY 19 COMMISSION MEETING WILL INCLUDE INFORMATION ABOUT MAPPING TOOLS.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

ANDY CALDWELL, HEARD REGARDING POSSIBILITY OF WORKING WITH CITIES DIVIDED BY DISTRICT GOING THROUGH THE SAME PROCESS, AND EDUCATING THE PUBLIC ON WHAT THE COUNTY IS AND DOES, AND HOW IT INTERRELATES WITH THE CITIES.

DR. JOHNSON STATED THAT INFORMATION WILL BE SHARED, AND SUGGESTS NOT COMBINING HEARINGS, AS THEY TEND NOT TO WORK OUT WELL.

SPENCER BRANDT, HEARD REGARDING THE IMPORTANCE OF MATERIALS DISTRIBUTION, AND ENCOURAGED LOOKING AT THE CENSUS COMPLETE COUNT COMMITTEE STRATEGIES IN SANTA BARBARA COUNTY.

LATA MURTI, HEARD REGARDING CLARIFICATION OF THE OUTREACH SUBCOMMITTEE.

CHAIR MORRIS BRIEFLY DESCRIBED THE OUTREACH SUBCOMMITTEE AND CONSISTS OF VICE CHAIR TURLEY, COMMISSIONER BRAY AND RIOS.

8. Discussion and direction to reassign Commissioner Olmeda from the At-Large position to the vacant Third District position, and to establish the process for appointing a candidate from the applicant pool to fill the At-Large position.

NDC REACHED OUT TO 13 CANDIDATES AND 6 ARE INTERESTED IN INTERVIEWING.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

CHARLES BELL, HEARD REGARDING THE LETTER SUBMITTED IN APRIL ABOUT FILLING THE DISTRICT 3 VACANCY, AND DISAGREES WITH THE COMMISSION'S CHOICE OF FAVORING PARTY PREFERENCE OVER LATINO UNDERREPRESENTATION.

ANDY CALDWELL, HEARD REGARDING CONCERNS ABOUT LATINO UNDERREPRESENTATION, OPPOSES SELECTING PARTY OVER MINORITY, AND REFERENCED ROBERT MERCADO'S RECENT OP ED.

LEE HELLER, HEARD AND COMMENTED THAT THE SELECTION TO FILL THE VACANCY MUST BE MADE FROM THE EXISTING POOL OF 45 CANDIDATES.

SPENCER BRANDT, HEARD REGARDING THE CANDIDATE POOL AND VACANCY.

KYRA SOLIS, HEARD REGARDING LATINX AND PARTY REPRESENTATION.

RENEE O'NEILL, HEARD REGARDING COMMISSIONERS KNOWING THEIR ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES, AND SUPPORTS A DIVERSE COMMISSION.

LATA MURTI, HEARD REGARDING THE GOOD FAITH EFFORT SHOWN IN SELECTING THE COMMISSIONERS, AND IN SUPPORT OF MOVING COMMISSIONER OLMEDO TO DISTRICT 3.

MS. ORDIN REVIEWED THE ORDINANCE REGARDING FILLING A VACANCY.

COMMISSIONER DISCUSSION INCLUDED THE FOLLOWING SUGGESTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS:

- SAFEGUARD AGAINST ETHNICITY/RACE, AND SELECT THE MOST QUALIFIED CANDIDATE.
- COMMISSIONER OLMEDO MAY SERVE BEST IN THE AT-LARGE POSITION AND ABLE TO WORK WITHIN ALL DISTRICTS THROUGH OUT THE COUNTY.
- MOVING COMMISSIONER OLMEDO TO DISTRICT 3 WILL EXPAND THE CANDIDATE POOL SELECTION FOR THE AT-LARGE POSITION.
- FILLING THE DISTRICT 3 VACANCY FROM THE EXISTING POOL MAY DECREASE THE CANDIDATE SELECTION.
- CONCERNS ABOUT THE LACK OF LATINO REPRESENTATION.
- EXPAND CANDIDATE POOL TO INTERVIEW KEVIN KASEFF, LUPE ALVAREZ, AND INCLUDE PREVIOUSLY INTERVIEWED CANDIDATE KEVIN ILAC.
- POSSIBLE VACANCIES MAY OCCUR IN THE FUTURE AND CONSIDERATION TO INTERVIEW DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATES ALSO.

COMMISSIONER OLMEDO COMMENTED HE WOULD BE MORE EFFECTIVE AND SERVE BEST IN THE AT-LARGE POSITION, AND IS WILLING TO SERVE WHEREVER NEEDED.

MRS. TILTON STATED THE EXISTING POOL CONSISTS OF 2 LATINO REPUBLICANS, AND 6 DEMOCRATS (NON-LATINO).

COMMISSIONER OLMEDO, STATED IT MAKES MORE SINCE FOR HIM TO MOVE TO DISTRICT 3, IN ORDER TO EXPAND THE CANDIDATE POOL FOR THE AT-LARGE SEAT.

DR. JOHNSON, COMMENTED THAT KEVIN ILAC IS THE ONLY REMAINING ASIAN CANDIDATE.

MOTION TO INTERVIEW THE 6 REMAINING DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATES, 2 LATINO REPUBLICAN CANDIDATES, AND KEVIN ILAC.

MOTION AMENDED TO INTERVIEW THE 6 REMAINING DEMOCRATIC AND 2 LATINO REPUBLICAN CANDIDATES, AND CONSIDER KEVIN ILAC (NO INTERVIEW – USE DECEMBER 9, 2020 INTERVIEW) FOR THE AT-LARGE POSITION WITH COMMISSIONER OLMEDO BEING REASSIGNED AS THE DISTRICT 3 REPRESENTATIVE.

"May you live in interesting times." This apocryphal phrase has been invoked in the Western world for decades. Sometimes it is perceived as a blessing; sometimes it is perceived as an ironic curse. Given the unprecedented events we are all now living through in the United States, I find it to be deeply appropriate in both senses.

With a pandemic spreading tragedy and chaos across the nation, and with wildfires currently spreading destruction across our beautiful home state, surely we might mark this moment as "cursed". But I also see the blessing: emergencies bring us together; they inspire us to rise to the level of our best selves.

My "best self" invites me to bring more to my already active civic engagement by applying to join the Santa Barbara Citizens' Independent Redistricting Commission. While I am a registered and regular voter, a member of my local chapter of the Women's League of Voters, and a volunteer in other community organizations, I have come to feel a particular urgency to serve my democracy in these "interesting times."

I remember reading local and state-wide journalism in 2010--at the moment of our last Census-- about the work that the Citizens Redistricting Commission was able to do after passage of the Voters First Act. As someone who voted for Proposition 11 in 2008, I felt proud of California's effort to "move the needle" on the constellation of problems that arise--not just in California but nationally--when legislatures become the central arbiter determining district boundaries, which in turn shape the outcome of elections. Citizen-staffed redistricting commissions in California seemed, to me, to be the best sort of democratic reform. Making citizen-commissioners central to an effort that privileged data-driven analysis and impartial deliberation over the "inside the beltway" status quo seemed to me then--and now--a good way to make elections more competitive and therefore fairer in every district throughout the state.

Yet in 2010, my interest was more "armchair" than "advocate." Since that time, I have become more civically active in my own community on a number of levels, and I have become more generally concerned about the integrity and durability of our nation's most cherished civic ritual: abiding by the "people's voice" through fair elections. I am applying to serve on the county redistricting commission because I am convinced that democracy is not a spectator sport--it requires more from each of us than we sometimes assume, and it requires all of us to pitch in, however we can, in local, state, national, and global arenas.

I am passionately committed to the power and promise of the franchise, and like most Americans, I am troubled by both the historic meaning of "gerrymandering" and the current legal and legislative battles that have tinkered with the outcomes of "one person one vote" in various states and counties

For most of my adult life, I have taught critical thinking, writing, and reading as a professor of English or American Studies at a variety of universities and community colleges. As such, I have learned that for most people, our assumptions about the world are alarmingly unexamined: most of us don't know what undergirds our opinions, our positions, or our views of others with whom we share community. But when we apply reason and inquiry in rigorous, methodical, and self-conscious effort--in other worlds, when we practice critical thinking--we can learn to "peel the onion" of our own (unexamined) worldviews.

I imagine that what is wanted in members of the county's redistricting commission is the skill of impartial analysis. By analysis, I mean the careful examination of complexities, or the breaking into parts of complicated systems in order to understand the whole.

The relevant analytical skills that belong to me and that might serve the goals of the commission rest primarily on words rather than numbers. Unlike (for example) accountants or computer scientists, my profession has taught me a deep reverence for words and their power to persuade, prevaricate, and promise all manner of things. I have learned to examine them, peer under their skin for biases, beauty, and missing claims, and to use them myself in support of my values and beliefs.

Pre-Map Hearings: Code Section 2-10.9A.060 (c) Before the commission draws a map, the commission shall conduct at least seven public hearings, allowing for public input on communities of interest and other matters that must be considered by the commission, and allow members of the public to present ideas and maps for consideration. These meetings are to take place over a period of no fewer than 30 days, with at least one public hearing held in each supervisorial district.

Post Map Hearings: Code Section 2-10.9A.060 (d) After the commission draws a draft map or alternative maps, the commission shall do both of the following: (1) Post the map or alternative maps for public comment on the Internet Web site of the County of Santa Barbara. (2) Conduct at least seven public hearings to take place over a period of no fewer than 30 days. Notice of each public hearing shall be published in a newspaper or newspapers of general circulation in all areas of the county at least seven days prior to the hearing.

(e) The commission shall establish and make available to the public a calendar of all public hearings described in paragraph (2). Hearings shall be scheduled at various times and days of the week to accommodate a variety of work schedules and to reach as large an audience as possible.

Elections Code 21508(d)(1) A draft map shall be published on the internet for at least seven days before being adopted as a final map (or 3 days within 28 days of deadline to adopt)
