## **Rules For Drawing the Lines**



In accordance with federal, state, county law, the Commission must draw lines pursuant to the following criteria, which are listed in order of priority:

1. Federal Laws	2. State Law and Measure G Requirements	3. Other Traditional Redistricting Principles

In addition, the Commission is prohibited from considering the residence of any incumbent or political candidate and districts shall not be drawn for purposes of favoring or discriminating against an incumbent, political candidate, or political party.
